Nottingham 350th

20 August

The Regiment will appear on Saturday, August 20 for the Nottingham, NH 350th celebration. This event has been changed from a weekend encampment to a one-day event.

Uniform is No. 2. Since there will be firing, muskets must be equipped with flints and hammerstalls. Companies should bring caps, hats, and forage caps. Military courtesies and correct 18th Century attire, free of anachronisms, are expected during all public hours.

Travel is by private vehicle; carpooling is encouraged. The address is 3 Ledge Farm Rd, Nottingham, NH (*The General Butler Farm*). Parking will be available near the site.

Arrival and camp set-up is no later than 08:30 hrs on Saturday the 20th. A small encampment will be set-up consisting of a kitchen fly, the museum wedge and 1 or 2 kitchen tables. We also would like a small row of ½ dozen or so wedge tents, thus members are asked to bring their tent.

The cost of meals will be covered by Col Paul O'Shaughnessy in honour of his 50 years of service to the Tenth.

The Tenth is the Crown Forces host regiment for this event and thus a good turnout is expected. Should you not be able to attend, or if you have questions about this order, contact your Company Serjeant as soon as possible.

Event Guidelines

Check In and Set Up

Check in and set up begins at 12:00 PM on Friday, August 19.

Look for the Quartermaster for directions.

Unload your vehicle as soon as possible and move it to the parking area.

Break down of camps begins at 3:00 PM on Sunday, August 21.

Only historically accurate camping is permitted. No modern camping on Nottingham Square.

Vehicles must be parked in the designated parking area with parking passes displayed on the vehicle dashboard.

Camp Hours

Camps will open each day at 9:30 AM. Camps close at 5:00 PM on Saturday and 3:00 PM on Sunday. Lights out and quiet at 11:00 PM.

Ice

Saturday AM and PM, and Sunday AM staff will come around camp and take orders and cash payment. Ice will then be delivered.

Fires

Fires must be in traditional fire pits.

Leave no fire unattended. Fires must be supervised at all times.

A full water bucket must be located next to your fire pit at all times.

Take firewood only from the designated areas.

Safety

In case of fire or medical emergencies dial 911 or locate Town emergency personnel on site.

For your own health, please drink plenty of water throughout the day and rest as needed. Watch for vehicle traffic when crossing roads.

Weapons

All edged weapons, firearms, and artillery shall be stored in a safe and deliberate manner at all times.

For the safety of all, obey the commands of your unit's officers.

Safety guidelines will follow those of the Continental Line and the British Brigade. Firearms will only be discharged at times designated by the event leadership. Random firing is prohibited. Only weapons and cartridges that have passed inspection may be fired. In any mock battle there is no paper, no wadding, and no ramming. Only powder shall be placed in firearms. Artillery will follow standard cannon drill.

Historical Authenticity

Participants are expected to dress appropriately for a Revolutionary War event. Impressions should be accurately portrayed and based on primary source documentation. Please keep all modern amenities such as coolers, plastic tarps, modern toys, electronics, modern cups, plastic bottles, and modern chairs out of the view of the public. Cell phones should be silenced during camp open hours.

Alcohol and Drugs

No alcoholic beverages may be consumed during camp open hours. Public drunkenness and possession of illegal drugs is prohibited and subject to law enforcement intervention.

Practical Considerations

Park only in the designated parking area.
Watch for traffic on Ledge Farm Road.
No pets in camp.
Do not enter roped off areas.
Keep valuables and equipment safe.

Departure

Thoroughly extinguish fires and fill in fire pits.
Return unused wood to the wood piles.
Pick up camp and dispose of trash as directed.
Be mindful of vehicle traffic during take down.
Leave Nottingham Square as we found it.
Safe travels home.
