**Regimental Order**

**11 April 2026**

*Lieut. Colonel Smith, 10th Regiment of Foot*

*Sir*

*Having received intelligence, that a quantity of Ammunition, Provision, Artillery, Tents and small arms, have been collected at Concord, for the Avowed Purpose of raising and supporting a Rebellion against His Majesty, you will March with the Corps of Grenadiers and Light Infantry, put under your command, with the utmost expedition and Secrecy to Concord, where you will seize and destroy all artillery, Ammunition, Provisions, Tents, Small Arms, and all Military Stores whatever. But you will take care that the Soldiers do not plunder the inhabitants, or hurt private property.*

*You have a Draught of Concord, on which is marked the Houses, Barns, &c., which contain the above military Stores. You will order a Trunion to be knocked off each gun, but if its found impracticable on any, they must be spiked, and the carriages destroyed. The Powder and stower must be shook out of the Barrels into the River, the Tents burnt, Pork or Beef destroyed in the best way you can devise. And the men may put Balls of lead in their pockets, throwing them by degrees into Ponds, Ditches &c, but no Quantity together, so that they may be recovered afterwards.*

*If you meet any Brass Artillery, you will order their muzzles to be beat in so as to render them useless.*

*You will observe by the Draught that it will be necessary to secure the two bridges as soon as possible, you will therefore Order a party of the best marchers, to go on with expedition for the purpose.*

*A small party on Horseback is ordered out to stop all advice of your March getting to Concord before you, and a small number of Artillery go out in Chaises to wait for you on the road, with Sledge Hammers, Spikes, &c.*

*You will open your business and return with the Troops, as soon as possible, which I must leave to your own Judgment and Discretion.*

## LEXINGTON GREEN, TOWER PARK, & LEXINGTON PARADE

18 April 2026

The Regiment will appear under the command of Lieut-Col Michael Graves for the Battle of Lexington Green, Tower Park, and the Lexington Patriot's Day parade on Saturday 18 April 2026.

Travel is by private vehicle.

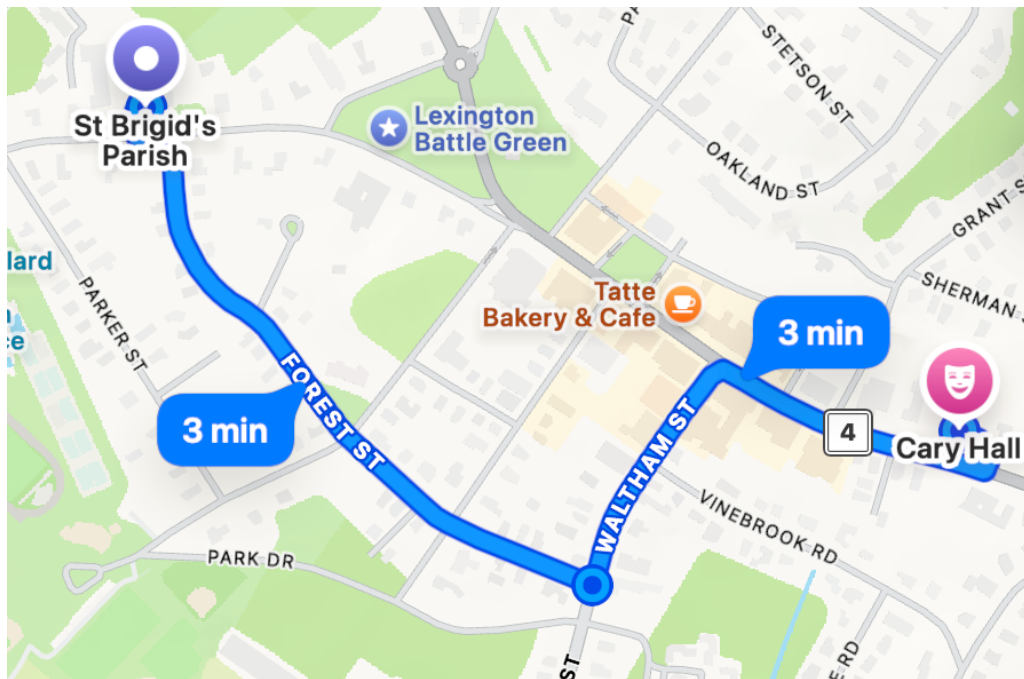
Dress for uniformed soldiers shall be No. 2 for all ranks: short gaiters, natural wigs, canteens filled with water, haversacks. Officers may wear shoes and gaiters in lieu of boots. All firelocks are to be equipped with flints, flash guards and hammerstalls as there will be firing.

### Schedule for the day:

**03:00 hrs** Begin arrival at St. Brigid's. The entrance is on Worthen Rd behind the church, as that portion of Massachusetts Ave will be blocked off. We have been asked to stay out of the public view to keep up the illusion of us marching from Boston. Coffee, donuts, etc. will be provided in the hall.

**04:15 hrs** Depart St. Brigid's on foot to travel to the muster area at Cary Hall (1605 Massachusetts Ave, Lexington). AVOID THE AREA AROUND LEXINGTON GREEN! We need to keep the illusion that we are not there. Please see the map below. Please remember to lower your voices as we are walking through neighborhoods. To get to Cary Hall:

- Leave St. Brigid's, cross Mass. Ave to Forest St.
- Follow Forest St. and at the end, take a left onto Waltham St.
- Follow Waltham St. until you reach Massachusetts Ave.
- Take a right onto Massachusetts Ave.

- 05:00 hrs** Assemble on Massachusetts Ave for safety inspection, distribution of powder, and swearing in new members.
- 05:45 hrs** Lexington Green event begins. This year, there will be some return firing from Buckman Tavern. We need soldiers to fall back and shoot at the tavern. Due to space and safety concerns, if you were unable to attend the rehearsal, we request that you do not run forward on the Green, but fall back.
- 06:30 hrs** Lexington Green event concludes.
- Scouting America (formerly Boy Scouts of America) are offering breakfast at St. Brigid's Church for \$10/person. There is no free breakfast or reserved seating for reenactors this year.
- The Lexington Minutemen will be holding a short formation on the Green after the Crown Forces leave. Thus, those wishing to return to the Green to interact with public are asked to wait until the Lexington Minutemen have marched off.
- 10:00 hrs** The Regiment will form in St. Brigid's parking lot to march to Munro Tavern. Meats, bread, cheese will be provided to members to take for lunch.
- 10:10 hrs** Depart St. Brigid's, marching down Massachusetts Ave., recreating Lt. Col. Smith's retreat from Concord.
- 10:30 hrs** Arrive at Munro Tavern. John Raymond is shot by British soldiers as he was standing in front of the tavern. Upon arrival, the field hospital at Munro Tavern will be re-created.
- 11:00 hrs** Battle of Tower Park.
- 11:45 hrs** Battle of Tower Park ends. The start of the Lexington Parade is just beyond Tower Park, at the intersection of Massachusetts Ave. and Maple St. The Regiment will march to the start of the parade.
- 13:30 hrs** Lexington parade begins. The Regiment will march the parade route back to St. Brigid's Church.
- 14:30 hrs** The parade concludes. End of the day's activities

Note that there is much going on this day and a lot of marching. The current forecast is showing a warm week in the 70s. Please be prepared for any weather and drink plenty of water over the next week.
